The meeting continued to the next item on the agenda.

That item being:

BZA-13-02c, a conditional use certificate request/review for the Pond Ice Rink submitted by Scot Lowry and Elisa/Jim Nash (N.P. Power, LLC and JE3, LLC) (an indoor recreational facility, an ice rink) located at 9999 Washington Street, Auburn Township Ohio 44023 in a B-1 zoning district.

Mr. Stewart commented that BZA-12-02c was for the Pond Ice Rink and turbines. He indicated that the turbines have been spinning since September and they are servicing the property with electricity. He also explained that a conditional use does not transfer with new ownership.

Scot Lowry reintroduced himself to the board and took the floor. He indicated that he did not want to be videotaped and asked that the camera be turned off. A brief discussion took place and the camera was turned off. Mr. Lowry indicated that his business is with the Board of Zoning Appeals and not only does he not want to be videotaped and he does not want any audio tape being used.

Mr. Lowry explained that the Pond Ice Rink has always been set up as 2 businesses, the rink [the business] and the property and recently a third business for the turbines. Mr. Lowry also introduced the Nashes. The Nashes are co applicants for the conditional use application and have been instrumental in the successfulness of the operation of the rink facility for the past 7 years.

Mr. Lowry explained that the turbines, at this point in time are providing approximately 25-30% of the annual consumption of electricity used by the Pond facility. He also explained that this time of year the turbines will produce more electricity, so that percentage may go up. He stated that all the electricity that is produced by the turbines is used at the Pond facility.

Mr. Lowry explained the business arrangement—Naromick owns the land and the building, the Pond operates the business and NP Power leases property and sells the power to the facility at a reduced rate. Mr. Lowry indicated that he and his partner Kevin Shaw owned all 3 entities. It was set up this way to secure grants. JE3 is the new owner of the facility, owns a 1% share of NP Power and NP Power continues to own the

turbines. Mr. Lowry further indicated that the power that is produced is for the rink, and that there was never intention to sell power to the grid.

Mr. Lowry further commented that all the programs at the rink were established by the new owner, Elisa Nash. She has acted as the general manager of the rink effectively for the last 7 years. Elisa Nash indicated that she and her husband live on Stafford in Auburn. Mr. Lowry indicated in reality it is not much of a change and that there is not anything different than how it has been run previously.

Seth Taylor,a contiguous property owner, indicated that the Rink has been great neighbors for the last seven (7) years. Lighting has not been an issue but the turbine seems to be making a vibrating noise that may be a nuisance.

Mr. Lowry indicated that there is an annual maintenance that is provided by the manufacture and will be conducted on the turbines and he hopes that will eliminate the noise. Mr. Tomsic asked Mr. Taylor to further explain that noise. Fire Chief John Phillips indicated that the noise could occur when the turbines change direction.

A question was asked about why sometimes one turbine spins and the other one does not. Mr. Lowry explained that he thinks one of the turbines is at a higher elevation. He also indicated that there is a prestart motor to help the blades begin turning.

Steth Taylor also commented about the maintenance of the south perimeter fence. It is intact now but may need some maintenance in the future.

A discussion took place regarding the abandonment of the turbines and the 2-\$15,000 bonds that can be used to remove the turbines. Mr. Tomsic was concerned that the amount of the bonds would be enough to cover the removal. Mr. Lowry will check into that and get back with the board for next year's review.

Motion by Lewis Tomsic to grant BZA-13-02c, a conditional use certificate request/review for the Pond Ice Rink submitted by Scot Lowry and Elisa/Jim Nash (N.P. Power, LLC and JE3, LLC) (an indoor recreational facility, an ice rink) located at 9999 Washington Street, Auburn Township Ohio 44023 in a B-1 zoning district with the following conditions:

- 1. The fence on the back property line must be maintained in a secure manner.
- 2. Should an exit driveway be put onto Bainbridge Road, the exit itself and safety lights on Bainbridge Road must be approved by the Geauga County Engineer prior to installation.
- 3. The Bainbridge Road access drive will be gated and used only as an exit for west bound traffic onto Bainbridge Road
- 4. Security will be provided on the premises: for high school hockey games by the Geauga County Sheriff's Department; for all other skating functions security will be by at least one adult staff member; security for private parties where alcohol is being served will be provided by the Geauga County Sheriff's Department.
- 5. Mandated maintenance and inspection reports will be provided to the Zoning Department and the AVFD, annually.
- 6. If necessary, filtering will be installed to minimize electromagnet radiation/interference.
