The Regular meeting of the Auburn Township Board of Trustees was called to order at 7:30 p.m. by Chairman Eugene T. McCune Jr. Two Trustees were present. ← TWICE

The Pledge of Allegiance was led by Emerick Gordon.

Motion by seconded Patrick J. Cavanagh by Michael S. Troyan to approve the minutes of the Regular Meeting of the Board of Trustees held on April 18, 2022. VOTE: Troyan, yes; Cavanagh, yes; McCune, yes. The motion passed.

REPORTS:

Frank Kitko, Zoning Inspector, submitted a zoning report reflecting 7 applications processed in the month of April resulting in 7 permits issued. Mr. Kitko noted the permits included 1 new home build and 3 solar panel permits. A variance application before the Board of Zoning Appeals was denied. The case could be appealed to court of common pleas. Zoning is monitoring the status of the proposed legislation in Columbus on short term rentals.

Emerick P. Gordon, Township Highway Superintendent, gave the following report for April:

- The month saw one weather event that required 60 tons of deicing material and three rounds of plowing. This brings the monthly average to 27 tons of road salt and the yearly total to 1863 tons. The new yearly average use is 1747 tons. Currently our dome is full with ~ 1900 tons of road salt. We have satisfied our contacted committed amount plus an additional 6%. The 2022/2023 Resolution to Participate has been accepted and we are committed to purchase 2000 tons +/- 10%.
- The 2022 Capital Improvement Project Paving of Various Roads has been awarded and earliest start date set as May 23rd, 2022. The chip seal project start date has yet to be determined. One cross culvert pipe on Wing Rd. will need to be replaced prior to chip sealing.
- Patching was performed on several roads and the larger repairs will be done using hot mix asphalt over the course of the construction season.
- Areas of erosion were stabilized on Taylor May Rd. and Fox Rd. using #1 crushed gravel. Minor ditching projects were completed as well.
- The 33% reduced load limits were released by the Geauga County Commissioners and all signs removed.
- We had one downed tree call due to high winds.

He reported the Asphalt Resurface of Various Roads Project are scheduled to begin May 23, 2022.

Michael S. Troyan spoke to the AVFD requests for ARPA funding. The fire department is re-examining what they are looking for based on different updated restrictions. They are prioritizing AED's for Adam Hall and the Auburn Community Park.

The department is looking into cleaning up dead trees, a few tree removals and planting grass at the southwest corner of the station's property. Trustee Cavanagh questioned if there would be a lot of debris disrupted requiring erosion control. Emerick Gordon said he did not think soil and water will be needed to be notified for this project.

Motion by Michael S. Troyan seconded by Patrick J. Cavanagh to approve and contract with Weaver Tree Service in the amount of \$2,000.00 to clear trees, brush, and grind stumps on the east side of the creek on the fire station property. VOTE: Troyan, yes; Cavanagh, yes; McCune, yes. The motion passed.

Trustee Troyan reported the total of Auburn Township's financial responsibility for this year's joint fireworks event with Bainbridge Township would be \$4,600.00 plus an approximate \$2,000.00 for the live bands, games and concessions.

Motion by Michael S. Troyan seconded by Patrick J. Cavanagh to partner with Bainbridge Township for the annual Firework Event and cover Auburn Township's portion of expenses, not to exceed \$7,000.00. VOTE: Troyan, yes; Cavanagh, yes; McCune, yes. The motion passed.

Patrick J. Cavanagh attended the status meeting for Stafford Road Reconstruction. The project is on schedule so far. There have been some issues with cable/internet providers moving a wire that needed to be relocated temporarily.

Eugene T. McCune Jr. reported on the Roadside Litter Clean-Up Event. It was a successful day and we had sunshine and lots of volunteers.

OLD BUSINESS:

Chairman McCune Jr. gave an update on the parking lot expansion project at the park. We are waiting on Joe Gutoskey to complete the survey and drawings for the WRLC conservation amendment.

NEW BUSINESS:

Fredrick May, Fiscal Officer, presented a Payment Report listing warrants 6972 – 7094 for a total of \$76,459.48. He presented Resolution 2022-16.

Motion by Patrick J. Cavanagh seconded by Michael S. Troyan to adopt Resolution 2022-15 for the following supplemental appropriations necessary for the day to day operation of the Township:

- \$60000 to 2031-330-360 Road and Bridge Fund, Natural Gas
- \$30000 to 10000-120-360- General Fund, Natural Gas
- \$30000 to 1000-690-353 General Fund, Recreation, Natural Gas
- \$60000 to 2191-120-353 Fire Fund, Natural Gas

VOTE: Troyan, yes; Cavanagh, yes; McCune, yes. The motion passed.

Trustee McCune Jr. went over the upcoming township event dates.

The Trustees discussed the fee schedule for the Large Item Trash Drop-Off Event.

Motion by Patrick J. Cavanagh seconded by Michael S. Troyan to keep the fee schedule the same as last year which is \$10.00 for a truck load, \$7.00 for a car load, no charge for tires and no charge for senior residents. VOTE: Troyan, yes; Cavanagh, yes; McCune, yes. The motion passed.

Emerick Gordon, Township Highway Superintendent, asked if he could hire two extra men to help out with both Trash Day Events. This was approved by the Board of Trustees.

PUBLIC COMMENTS:

There was one question from a resident.

ADJOURNMENT:

Motion by Eugene T. McCune Jr. seconded by Patrick J. Cavanagh to adjourn the meeting. VOTE: Troyan, yes; Cavanagh, yes; McCune, yes. The motion passed. The meeting was adjourned at 8:12pm.

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


