The Regular meeting of the Auburn Township Board of Trustees was called to order at 7:30 p.m. by Chairman Eugene T. McCune Jr. All Trustees were present.

The Pledge of Allegiance was led by Logan Standley.

Motion by Patrick J. Cavanagh seconded by Michael S. Troyan to approve the minutes of the Public Hearing of the Board of Trustees held on September 6, 2022. VOTE: Troyan, yes; Cavanagh, yes; McCune Jr., yes. The motion passed.

GUESTS:

Jim Zuccaro, OTARMA Insurance Agent, gave a recap of coverages stating 3 mill liability, 9 mill property and .5 mill miscellaneous coverage for an annual premium of \$40,035.00. He noted there is a \$1,350.00 give back to OTARMA members.

Logan Standley, Auburn Troop 101 Boy Scout, is working on obtaining Eagle Scout status. To fulfill his community project requirement, he proposed building 4 trash containers at the Auburn Community Park. Logan's estimate from Carter Lumber in Solon totals approximately \$1,514.00.

Trustee Cavanagh suggested fundraising to cover the cost. He also suggested Logan price check with Hartville Lumber in Middlefield. Some companies have been known to donate lumber for Scout projects.

Michael S. Troyan recommended covering the shortfall after donations.

The Trustees signed off on the proposed project that begins September 10th with a completion date of September 17th.

REPORTS:

Frank Kitko, Zoning Inspector, submitted a zoning report reflecting 16 applications processed in the month of August resulting in 15 permits issued.

He spoke to Crash Champions renovation progress after the fire. Mr. Kitko discussed the sewage dump site at Bell Road and Munn Road. He has concerns about refuse being dumped on site. Frank will check with the County as to who oversees that business.

Emerick Gordon, Township Highway Superintendent submitted the following report for August:

- With the Capital Improvement projects finishing up all that was left were punch list items and minor issues. The asphalt resurfacing of various roads was completed with just the line striping remaining. Projects for the 2023 construction season have been submitted to the engineer's office and some of preliminary work will begin this fall.
- The roadside mower was out but is still experiencing electrical gremlins. Despite recent repair the intermittent problem still persists and will need to be serviced. Brush was cleared around several signs and intersections to improve sight distance.
- We had one drive pipe replacement on Creighton Dr. and one small ditching project on Brookfield Dr. Erosion issues on Stafford Rd. were addressed with 1 ton of #1 gravel.
- Asphalt patching was done on several roads as well as bleed through control on chip sealed roads.

He reviewed an updated request for AARPA funding from the AVFD. Keith Blaser gave the following list of prioritized items:

- \$ 37,756.64 Replacement of SCBA air pack bottles that expire spring 2023.
- \$161,933.23 Emergency alerting equipment, mobile and portable radios. If funds remain in the AARPA account, an additional \$40,000.00 to purchase 10 sets of turnout gear, replacing gear that expires in the next 24 months.

Trustee Cavanagh requested the balance of AARPA funds remaining.

Patrick J. Cavanagh, passed on his report.

Fredrick May, Fiscal Officer, was not present, but pre-submitted Resolution 2022-31.

Eugene T. McCune Jr. reported the architect working on the parking lot expansion at the park is not making progress. He suggested looking for alternates.


