**Motion by Michael S. Troyan seconded by Patrick J. Cavanagh approve the minutes of the Regular Meeting of the Board of Trustees held on February 20, 2023. VOTE: Troyan, yes; McCune, yes; Cavanagh, yes. The motion passed.**

**REPORTS:**

**Frank Kitko, Zoning Inspector**, submitted a zoning report reflecting 5 applications processed in the month of February resulting in 5 permits issued. Mr. Kitko requested prosecutor action for pending short term rental cases and the prosecutor responded that all actions need to come at the request of the Board of Trustees.

**Motion by Michael S. Troyan seconded by Eugene T. McCune Jr. to send a letter to the Prosecutor requesting action be taken on the two pending short term rental cases. VOTE: Troyan, yes; McCune, yes; Cavanagh, yes. The motion passed.**

**Emerick P. Gordon, Township Highway Superintendent** gave the following report for February:

- February saw four weather events that required 6 rounds plowing and or salting. A total of 150 tons of deicing material was used. This brings our new monthly average to 489 tons.
- There were high winds and an ice event that cause several trees and large limbs to come down. Cleanup was done on Quinn, Stafford and Taylor May Roads as well as Saybrook Dr. and Adam Hall.
- Cold patching was done on various roads and will continue until the asphalt hot mix plants open.
- Preliminary tree and brush clearing were completed on capital improvement paving projects Sanctuary Dr, Golden Pond and Bridge Creek Trail.

Emerick reminded everyone that the Senior Resident Trash Pick-Up Event is scheduled for June 1<sup>st</sup> and 2<sup>nd</sup>. We work in conjunction with the Geauga County Department on Ageing and seniors must pre-register with that department.

**Michael S. Troyan** spoke to the 2023 Auburn Bainbridge Fireworks Event which will be held on Monday, July 3<sup>rd</sup> with a rain date of Friday, July 7<sup>th</sup>. The cost of the event will be split using Ohio census calculations resulting in 36% Auburn's responsibility and 64% Bainbridge's responsibility. Mr. Troyan submitted an invoice from Bainbridge for \$5,580.00 to cover Auburn's share of the fireworks cost.

Trustee Troyan reported the AVFD received a grant for approximately \$270,000.00 to replace air packs for the department. The air pack replacement cost was also included in the ARPA Fund Expenditure Resolution 2022-47, enacted by the Board of Trustees on 12/19/2022. The Fire Department will replace with something that is comparable in cost.

**Eugene T. McCune Jr.** relinquished his time.







**RESOLUTION NO. 2023-08**

*Authorizing Expenditure from American Rescue Plan Act Funds*

**GEAUGA County, Ohio**

**Be It Resolved** by the Township Trustees of **AUBURN Township**

**WHEREAS**, this date, **MARCH 6 2023**, Trustee Patrick J Cavanagh moved the adoption of the following Resolution:

**WHEREAS**, the Township has received a distribution of monies (the “ARPA Funds”) from the American Rescue Plan Act of 2021 (“ARPA” or the “Act”); and

**WHEREAS**, Congress passed the Act effective March 11, 2021; and

**WHEREAS**, Section 603 created the Coronavirus Local Fiscal Recovery Fund which, among other things, appropriated money to cities, nonentitlement units of local government, and counties to mitigate the fiscal effects stemming from the public health emergency with respect to the Coronavirus Disease (Covid-19); and

**WHEREAS**, Section 603(c) generally provides that:

(1) USE OF FUNDS. Subject to paragraph (2), and except as provided in paragraphs (3) and (4), a metropolitan city, nonentitlement unit of local government, or county shall only use the funds provided under a payment made under this section to cover costs incurred by the metropolitan city, nonentitlement unit of local government, or county, by December 31, 2024 -

(A) to respond to the public health emergency with respect to the Coronavirus Disease 2019 (COVID–19) or its negative economic impacts, including assistance to households, small businesses, and nonprofits, or aid to impacted industries such as tourism, travel, and hospitality;

(B) to respond to workers performing essential work during the COVID–19 public health emergency by providing premium pay to eligible workers of the metropolitan city, nonentitlement unit of local government, or county that are performing such essential work, or by providing grants to eligible employers that have eligible workers who perform essential work;

(C) for the provision of government services to the extent of the reduction in revenue of such metropolitan city, nonentitlement unit of local government, or county due to the COVID–19 public health emergency relative to revenues collected in the most recent full fiscal year of the metropolitan city, nonentitlement unit of local government, or county prior to the emergency; or

(D) to make necessary investments in water, sewer, or broadband infrastructure.

**WHEREAS**, Department of Treasury Final Rule, published by the Federal Register on January 27, 2022, at Vol. 87, No. 18, 4438 – 4454, and effective April 1, 2022, provides in part that:

Treasury is including an option for recipients to use a standard allowance for revenue loss. Specifically, in the final rule, recipients will be permitted to elect a fixed amount of loss that can then be used to fund government services. This fixed amount, referred to as the “standard allowance,” is set at up to \$10 million total for the entire period of performance not to exceed the recipient’s SLFRF award amount.

**WHEREAS**, the Rule further observes based on extensive analysis by the Treasury that:

The \$10 million level is based on average revenue loss across state and local governments, taking into consideration potential variation in revenue types and losses and continued uncertainty faced by many recipients regarding revenue shortfalls.

**WHEREAS**, the Rule further clarifies that recipients can use SLFRF funds on government services up to the revenue loss amount, whether that be the standard allowance amount or the amount calculated using the formula set forth in the Rule. Government services generally include any service traditionally provided by a government, unless treasury has stated otherwise.

**WHEREAS**, some common examples of “government services” identified by Treasury in the Rule and in the “Coronavirus State & Local Fiscal Recovery Funds: Overview of the Final Rule” (hereinafter “the SLFRF Overview of Final Rule”) are as follows:

- Road building and maintenance, and other infrastructure
- Health services
- General government administration, staff, and administrative facilities
- School or educational services
- Construction of schools and hospitals
- Environmental remediation
- Provision of police, fire, and other public safety services (including purchase of fire trucks and police vehicles)
- Maintenance or pay-go funded building infrastructure
- Modernization of cybersecurity, including hardware, software, and protection of critical infrastructure

**WHEREAS**, the Treasury has recognized in the SLFRF Overview of Final Rule “Government services generally include any service traditionally provided by a government, unless Treasury has stated otherwise” and that “Government services is the most flexible eligible use category under the SLFRF program, and funds are subject to streamlined reporting and compliance requirements.” and

**WHEREAS**, the SLFRF Overview of the Final Rule further states that funds utilized pursuant to the standard revenue loss allowance continue to have certain restrictions, including generally prohibiting:

- Offsetting a reduction in net tax revenue
- Deposit into pension funds

- Debt service or replenishing financial reserves
- Satisfaction of settlements or judgments
- Contributions to financial reserves or “rainy day” funds
- Use for projects that conflicts with or contravenes the American Rescue Plan Act
- Use in violation of Terms and Conditions of the award or conflict of interest requirements under the Uniform Guidance
- Use of funds in violation of other applicable laws and regulations or outside of SLRF program requirements

Whereas, The Board has identified a project which, in the judgment of the Board, qualifies as a permitted use of the ARPA Funds, in direct support of governmental services which consists of the following:

**UPDATE TOWNSHIP INFORMATION TECHNOLOGY EQUIPMENT & SERVICES**

**NOW THEREFORE**, it is hereby RESOLVED by the Board that:

1. The Township elected to use the standard allowance by way of **Resolution 2022-13** and its presumption of revenue loss due to the public health emergency and to use the amount authorized herein to fund government services.

2. The Project is hereby authorized and shall be paid for from the ARPA Funds in the amount of/an amount not to exceed: **\$37,933.89.**

3. The Project described herein serves the objectives of the Act by providing services traditionally provided by a government, namely:

- Police protection
- Fire and emergency medical services
- Road repair, maintenance and other transportation and safety services
- Public infrastructure support
- General government administration and administrative facilities
- Land use regulations and enforcement
- Parks and recreational facilities and programs
- Other

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
4. Accordingly, the Project is in the best interests of the Township and is deemed a priority for the community.


5. No obligations paid under the authority of this Resolution were incurred prior to March 3, 2021.


