The Regular meeting of the Auburn Township Board of Trustees was called to order at 7:30 p.m. by Patrick J. Cavanagh. All Trustees were present.

The Pledge of Allegiance was led by Don Rice.

All three Trustees spoke in memory of Fredrick L. May.

GUESTS:

Don Rice, Superintendent of the Geauga County Board of Developmental Disabilities spoke to the Trustees about the Metzenbaum Center. The Metzenbaum Center serves approximately 1,100 Geauga County residents by helping them to live, learn and earn in our community.

Elizabeth Keller-Hauser presented a proposal from Colonial Life.

Motion by Eugene T. McCune Jr. seconded by Michael S. Troyan to approve the minutes of the Public Hearing Meeting of the Board of Trustees held on April 17, 2023. VOTE: Troyan, yes; McCune, yes; Cavanagh, yes. The motion passed.

REPORTS:

Frank Kitko, Zoning Inspector, submitted a zoning report reflecting 15 applications processed in the month of April resulting in 15 permits issued.

Emerick P. Gordon, Township Highway Superintendent gave the following report for April:

- April saw no appreciable accumulation of snow that required plowing and or salting. The 2022 / 2023 ODOT contract has been satisfied with 1800 tons of deicing material purchased, received and stacked in the salt dome. Currently we have ~ 2150 tons of road salt in inventory and the new 2023 / 2024 ODOT Resolution to Participate has been submitted and accepted.
- There was one high wind event on April 1st that brought down trees and limbs on several roads. Attention had to be given the Auburn Community Park trail as three trees were suspended precariously over the walking path.
- Preliminary work for the paving of various roads is underway with the replacement of two large cross culvert pipes on Bridge Creek Tr. scheduled to begin the first week of May 2023. Spot ditching and the removal of debris in the drainage infrastructure of scheduled roads has also begun and will continue until paving begins.
- Cold patching was done on several roads as well as berm repair.
- With the passing of the resolution restricting engine brake use within the township, we have installed ten of the fourteen signs slated for county roads and will have the balance installed in the next two weeks.
- Remember to call the Geauga County Department on Aging to sign up for a spot on our senior trash pickup days, June 1st and 2nd. Pickups are held to 100 spots for qualifying Auburn Twp. seniors.

Mr. Gordon entertained a question from resident, Chris Chaney, about intrusive plants at the Auburn Community Park.

REPORTS (continued):

Michael S. Troyan submitted an expense report for Auburn Fire Department equipment expenses. He noted he has been fielding lots of questions from residents regarding NOPEC's opt-in/opt-out policy and rate increase.

Eugene T. McCune Jr. also has been receiving calls about NOPEC.

Patrick J. Cavanagh presented the 2023 Crack Seal BID PACKAGE. The legal ad will be published May 11, 2023; Bid Deadline is 4:00PM on June 5, 2023; and bids will be opened at the Board of Trustees Regular Meeting on June 5, 2023.

Daniel J. Matsko, Fiscal Officer, presented a payment report listing warrants 56-2023 and 7763 through 7792 totaling \$115,013.08. He presented Resolution 2023-17 and Resolution 2023-18.

Motion by Michael S. Troyan seconded by Patrick J. Cavanagh to adopt Resolution 2023-17 for the permanent reallocation of the following funds:

- \$99,822.37 Interfund transfer from GENERAL FUND 1000 to SPECIAL LEVY FIRE FUND 2191 for receipt of 2018 insurance settlement into correct fund.

Motion by Patrick J. Cavanagh seconded by Eugene T. McCune Jr. to adopt Resolution 2023-18 for the following Increased Revenue & Supplemental Appropriations:

- \$76,140.00 Supplemental Appropriation to Special Levy Fire Fund – Capital Outlay 2191-760-740 MACHINERY, EQUIPMENT AND FURNITURE for payment of overdue insurance proceeds from 2018.
- \$2,789.00 received from State Fire Marshall for 2022 Training Grant awarded to Auburn Fire Department increasing 2191 Fire Levy Fund revenues.
- \$2,789.00 Supplemental Appropriation to Special Levy Fire Fund – Fire Protection 2191-220-599 OTHER – OTHER EXPENSES for payment received from State Fire Marshal 2022 Training Grant Award.

OLD BUSINESS:

The Trustees discussed proposed Zoning Amendment ZC2023-01. Specifically they discussed the outdoor shooting range limitations and changed it to be prohibited in commercial areas.

New smoke detectors were installed in the Administration building by Gillmore Security.

The Trustees discussed franchise fees received.


