The Regular meeting of the Auburn Township Board of Trustees was called to order at 7:31 p.m. by Chairman, Michael S. Troyan. All Trustees were present.

The Pledge of Allegiance was led by Fire Chief, John Phillips.

Motion by Patrick J. Cavanagh seconded by Eugene T. McCune Jr. to approve the minutes of the Regular Meeting of the Board of Trustees on April 15, 2024. VOTE: McCune Jr., yes; Cavanagh, yes, Troyan, yes. The motion passed.

REPORTS:

Frank Kitko, Zoning Inspector, submitted a zoning report reflecting 15 applications processed in the month of April. There are two (2) variance cases to be presented to the BZA.

Emerick P. Gordon, Township Highway Superintendent, gave the following report for April:

- April saw one weather event that due to warm road surfaces and rising temperatures required no plowing and or salting. The new yearly average for deicing material usage stands at 1709 tons. After receiving a 1000-ton delivery of road salt, we currently have ~ 1535 tons in our dome. There is room for an additional 400 tons which will be ordered this week. The Resolution to Participate in ODOT's rock salt purchasing aggregate has been uploaded and received with our committed amount reduced to 1800 tons based on data collected.
- There were two high wind events that caused several trees around the township to come down and some minor flooding due to heavy rains. The chipping of the downed trees and additional tree removal was done on several roads.
- The 24 new trees to delineate the western buffer / conservancy boundary were picked up and planted at Auburn Community Park. The security system DVR has been replaced and all cameras are up and running.
- Patching was done on various roads and will continue where needed.

Eugene T. McCune Jr. attended the second Kenston School Board meeting where they discussed two finalists for the open Superintendent position. Bruce Wilmingham Jr. was selected.

Trustee McCune Jr. gave an update to the proposed bathroom facility at the park. He advised soil testing for septic is scheduled for May 13th. The location for the septic is in dispute. The passive space in the wooded area is not acceptable.

Patrick J. Cavanagh attended a CEI demonstration at the Fire Station. It was very informative.

Dan Matsko, Deputy Fiscal Officer, presented the payment listing for payments processed since April 16, 2024, reflecting 10 electronic payments processed (\$54,338.58) and 23 warrants processed (\$54,914.78) totaling \$109,253.36.

He presented the April Bank Reconciliation and the following savings accounts balances totaling \$3,086,604.83 as of April 30, 2024: Primary checking account balance - \$1,906,748.12; Star Ohio balance = \$1,179,856.71.

Mr. Matsko announced that only 1 person, Christine Blaser, applied for assistant to Fiscal Officer position. He plans to hire her on June 10th after she returns from vacation. The Board will acknowledge hiring and approve at the meeting prior to June 10, 2024.

NEW BUSINESS:

Chief Phillips spoke to the condition of the water at the fire station. They are using the original well drilled in 1977 @ 101ft. The Chief submitted a quote of \$36,875.00 to drill a new 240'-340' well.

Trustee Troyan advised communications from Altice stating that they do not wish to renew their contract for cable service in Auburn Township. Per the Ohio Revised Code, Trustees must pass a resolution to continue collecting franchise fees.

Motion by Patrick J. Cavanagh seconded by Eugene T. McCune Jr. to adopt Resolution 2024-10 Establishing a video service provider fee to be paid by any video service provider offering video service in the Township of Auburn. VOTE: McCune Jr., yes; Cavanagh, yes; Troyan, yes. The motion passed.

The Trustees discussed improvement to the detention pond at the park and Soil and Water's request to have them recorded at the County.

Motion by Michael S. Troyan seconded by Eugene T. McCune Jr. to adopt Resolution 2024-11 Declaration of restrictive covenants for inspection and maintenance. VOTE: McCune Jr., yes; Cavanagh, yes; Troyan, yes. The motion passed.

Motion by Patrick J. Cavanagh seconded by Eugene T. McCune Jr. to deposit franchise fees received from CSC Holdings, LLC (dba Altice) in the amount of \$1,557.65 in the Land Acquisition and Improvement Fund. VOTE: McCune Jr., yes; Cavanagh, yes; Troyan, yes. The motion passed.

The Trustees discussed the fee schedule for the community trash event.

Motion by Michael S. Troyan seconded by Eugene T. McCune Jr. to charge \$10 per carload and small truck, \$15 per full size truck load and 0 charge for senior residents at the Large Item Drop Off Event. VOTE: McCune Jr., yes; Cavanagh, yes; Troyan, yes. The motion passed.

PUBLIC COMMENT:

Karl Schneider asked when will a group meet at the park next to discuss the septic system. The Trustees answered that the next meeting is on Monday, May 13, 2024.

A resident questioned if the township was thinking of selling or developing the 13-acre, township owned property, south of the freeway because he saw someone walking it.

A resident questioned the status of previous road levy monies collected illegally and wondered if it would be refunded to the residents. Trustee Cavanah answered it is in the hands of the state.

Motion by Michael S. Troyan seconded by Eugene T. McCune Jr. to adjourn the meeting. VOTE: Troyan, yes; McCune, yes; Cavanagh, yes. The motion passed. The meeting was adjourned at 8:35 p.m.

- 1. The Township will seek address recommendations from the Geauga County Tax Map Department for the assignment of house numbers on the streets and roads in the unincorporated areas of the Township;
- 2. The Township will review said recommendations for approval or rejection, and will communicate its decision to the Geauga County Engineer's Tax Map Department;

RESOLUTION 2024-10

A RESOLUTION ESTABLISHING A VIDEO SERVICE PROVIDER FEE TO BE PAID BY ANY VIDEO SERVICE PROVIDER OFFERING VIDEO SERVICE IN THE TOWNSHIP

The Board of Trustees of Auburn Township, Geauga County, Ohio, met in [special/general] session on the <u>6</u> day of <u>May</u> 2024, at the Auburn Administration building, 11010 Washington Street, with the following members present: Eugene T. McCune Jr., Patrick J. Cavanagh, and Michael S. Troyan.

WHEREAS, the Ohio General Assembly enacted Sections 1332.21 through 1332.34 of the Ohio Revised Code, effective September 24, 2007, to provide a statewide "uniform regulatory framework" for the provision of cable television and/or other video service (the "Video Law"); and

WHEREAS, under the Video Law a video service provider that is providing video service to subscribers in the Township pursuant to a state-issued video service authorization must pay the Township a video service provider fee ("VSP Fee") based on a percentage of the provider's gross revenues received from providing video service in the Township, not to exceed five percent (5%) of such gross revenues; and

WHEREAS, the Video Law requires that the percentage of gross revenues on which VSP Fees are paid must be the same as the percentage of gross revenues that a cable operator pays pursuant to a franchise agreement that is in effect in the Township (the VSP Fee Percentage") or, if there is no effective franchise agreement under which franchise fees are payable for a given calendar quarter, the VSP Fee percentage shall be zero percent (0%) of gross revenues unless the Township determines by Resolution that the VSP Fee will be a percentage of gross revenues not to exceed five percent (5%) of gross revenues; and

WHEREAS, the Video Law further requires the Township to provide a video service provider with written notice of the VSP Fee Percentage within ten (10) days of receiving notice from the video service provider, pursuant to R.C. 1332.27(A), that it will begin offering service in the Township; and

WHEREAS, the Video Law provides that advertising revenues will not be included in the gross revenues base upon which the VSP Fee Percentage is applied unless the Township specifically enacts an Resolution uniformly applicable to all video service providers requiring that advertising revenues also be included in the gross revenues base; and

WHEREAS, the Video Law requires the Township to promptly notify affected video service providers of the Resolution that requires the inclusion of advertising revenues in the gross revenues base and that requirement will not take effect until the first day of the first calendar quarter that begins more than thirty (30) days after giving such notice of the Resolution; and

WHEREAS, in order to provide timely notice to a video service provider of the VSP Fee Percentage and of the inclusion of advertising revenues in the VSP Fee gross revenues base, it is necessary for the Board of Trustees of Auburn Township, Geauga County, Ohio (i) to establish the VSP Fee Percentage; (ii) to include advertising revenues in the VSP Fee gross revenues base, and (iii) to authorize the Fiscal Officer to provide the appropriate notice of the VSP Fee Percentage and the inclusion of advertising revenues in gross revenues to a video service provider within ten (10) days of the Township receiving notice that a video service provider will begin providing service in the Township.

BE IT RESOLVED, by the Board of Trustees of Auburn Township, Geauga County, Ohio:

Section 1. That the Board of Trustees of Auburn Township hereby establishes a VSP Fee that is calculated by applying a VSP Fee Percentage of five percent (5%) to the video service provider's gross revenues as defined in Section 1332.32(B) of the Video Law. For purposed of calculating the VSP Fee, the provider's gross revenues shall include advertising revenues in accordance with Section 1332.32(B)(2)(g) of the Video Law. The VSP Fee Percentage and Video Law gross revenues definition, as modified in this Resolution, shall apply equally to all video service providers and cable television operators providing video service in the Township.

Section 2. That the VSP Fee shall be paid by each video service provider providing service in the Township on a quarterly basis but not sooner than forty-five (45) days nor later than sixty (60) days after the end of the each calendar quarter. R.C. §1332.32(A).

Section 3. That the Auburn Township Fiscal Officer is authorized and directed to provide any video service provider with notice of the VSP Fee Percentage and gross revenues definition as determined by this Board above, which notice shall be given by certified mail, upon receipt of notice from such video service provider that it will begin providing video service in the Township pursuant to a state-issued video service authorization.

Section 4. That it is found and determined that all formal actions of the Board concerning and relating to the adoption of the Resolution were adopted in an open meeting of this Board, and all deliberations of the Board and any of its committees that resulted in such formal action were in meetings open to the public in compliance with all legal requirements.

DECLARATION OF RESTRICTIVE COVENANTS FOR INSPECTION & MAINTENANCE

This Declaration of Restrictive Covenants for Inspection and Maintenance (hereinafter the "Declaration of Agreement") is made on the 6th day of May 2024 by Auburn Township Board of Trustees (hereinafter the "Owner"), for itself and its successors and assigns, for the benefit of Geauga Soil and Water Conservation District (hereinafter the "District").

RECITALS

WHEREAS, Owner owns real property located in Auburn Township, Geauga County, Ohio, the legal description for such real property being attached hereto as Auburn Community Park, 17848 Munn Road (hereinafter the "Property"); and

WHEREAS, Owner will construct certain improvements on the Property and, in connection therewith, will cause to be constructed on the Property a storm water retention basin; and

WHEREAS, Owner desires to describe herein its agreements with respect to the inspection and maintenance of the said storm water retention basin, and certain other agreements in connection therewith, all of such agreements to be for the benefit of the District.

NOW, therefore, Auburn Township Board of Trustees hereby declares the following agreements and covenants for the Property:

- 1. <u>DEFINITIONS</u>: As used in this Declaration of Agreements, the following terms shall have the designated meanings:
 - (a) Facility: That certain storm water detention basin facility consisting of an approximate ¼ acre pond and all associated appurtenances on the Property.

2. MAINTENANCE:

- (a) It is the Owner's responsibility to maintain and make all necessary repairs to the Facility located on the Property to ensure its original designed function including but not limited to the following:
 - 1) Stormwater Pond Monthly Maintenance
 - 1. Removal of floating debris
 - 2. Removal of woody vegetative growth from pond area including embankments
 - 3. Removal of trash and/or sediment accumulation
 - 4. Removal of obstructions in orifices and/or outlets
 - 5. Mowing of pond, banks, and dam
 - 2) Stormwater Pond Annual Maintenance
 - 1. Repair erosion to the outfall or spillway
 - 2. Repair and/or replace any damaged structures (i.e. catch basins, risers, pipes, headwalls)
 - 3. Debris should be removed from overflow spillway and grates.
- 3. <u>CHANGES</u>: Owner will not eliminate or make structural changes or modifications to the Facility without the prior written approval from the District.

- 2. ACCESS: Owner hereby grants to the District the right to inspect the Facility. The District shall give the Owner at least ten days prior written notice of its intent to inspect the Facility. Owner hereby grants to the District the right to enter upon the Property for purpose of inspection of the Facility, subject to requirements for notice described above.
- RECORDING: This Declaration of Agreements shall be recorded in the Geauga County Recorders' Office.
- 4. BINDING EFFECT: This Declaration of Agreements shall be binding upon and shall inure to the benefit of, the parties hereto and their successors and assigns; provided, however, upon a sale of the Property, the owner of the Property, including without limitation the Owner, shall be released from any and all liabilities and obligations under this Declaration of Agreements which accrue from and after the date of sale. The Owner, and its successors and assigns, shall only be obligated hereunder so long as it or they own fee simple title to the Property. This Declaration of Agreements shall run with the land and shall be binding upon future owner thereof.
- NOTICE: Any notice permitted or required to be given pursuant to the terms of this Declaration of Agreements shall be deemed properly given if either hand delivered, or mailed by certified U.S. mail, return receipt requested, or sent by overnight courier requiring signature of receipt, to the following addresses:
