The meeting of the Auburn Township Board of Trustees was called to order at 7:30 p.m. by Chairman Michael S. Troyan. All Trustees were present.

The Pledge of Allegiance was led by Geauga County Auditor, Charles A. Walder.

**GUESTS:**

**Charles E. Walder, Geauga County Auditor**, was present and discussed the accidental collection of an expired Road and Bridge Levy in Auburn Township for 2020, 2021 and 2022.

Per ORC. 319.46 the collected money plus interest must be paid back to the residents. The County Auditor is to notify the Board of Revisions who will Certify the amount required to reimburse. Auditor Walder advised the total was approximately \$700,000.

Mr. Walder recommended the township pursue a tax anticipation note. He explained that a tax anticipation note is a type of debt security issued by a state or local government to raise money for a capital project. The township would use inside milage as collateral for the note.

Discussion ensued regarding the multiple entities that share responsibility for the collection of this levy after it expired in 2015. Mr. Walder stated all administrative costs will be paid by the County. He did feel that the anomaly of renewing levies early contributed to the confusion.

**Chief John Phillips, AVFD**, presented a Year-to-Date Statistics Report comparing 387 year-to-date calls in 2024 to 377 calls in 2023. The percentage of multiple calls was 21.70% for January-May 2024 compared to 19.94% in 2023.

Chief Phillips presented the contract from Valley Fire District to purchase a used 2008 rescue vehicle for \$10,000.00.

**Eugene T. McCune Jr.** met with Shane Wohlken, Land Steward Western Reserve Land Conservancy, and did a walk-through of Auburn Community Park on August 5<sup>th</sup>. Trustee McCune Jr. reported phase II of the 2024 cemetery monument restoration phase is in progress. The restoration is being funded by the generous donation from the Auburn Community Church when they closed their doors.

**Patrick J. Cavanagh** reported the Capital Improvement Project of Road Resurfacing is ahead of schedule.

**Dan Matsko, Fiscal Officer**, presented the payment listing for payments processed since June 3, 2024, listing 16 electronic payments processed (\$63,983.22) and 24 warrants processed (\$16,066.49) totaling \$80,049.71.

Dan Matsko reported the search for an assistant to the Fiscal Officer is complete. Lorraine Sevich was interviewed and is being recommended for the position.

**Michael S. Troyan** reported Geauga Health Department has requested to collect mosquitoes on our township properties for research.




