The regular meeting of the Auburn Township Board of Trustees was called to order at 7:00 p.m. by Trustee Chairman Eugene T. McCune Jr. Also in attendance were Trustees Patrick J. Cavanagh and Michael S. Troyan.

The Pledge of Allegiance was led by resident Mr. Fred Bauer.

MINUTE APPROVAL:

Motion by Michael S. Troyan, seconded by Patrick J. Cavanagh, to approve the minutes of the Regular Meeting of the Auburn Township Board of Trustees held on April 21, 2025. VOTE: Cavanagh, yes; Troyan, yes; McCune Jr., yes. The motion PASSED.

SCHEDULED REPORTS:

Mr. Frank Kitko, Zoning Inspector, submitted a Zoning report reflecting 14 applications submitted in the month of April of 2025.

Mr. Michael Fenstermaker, Road Superintendent, gave a report for April of 2025:

Resident requests:

- Replacement of driveway pipe on Thorpe
- Tree leaning on Taylor May near Quinn
- Ditching on Taylor May west of Thorpe
- Ditching on Taylor May near Route 44
- Tree down on Bartholomew Road, west of Auburn Road
- Berm repair on Chateau Trail
- Ditching on Stafford, East of Route 44
- Repair erosion in front of driveway on Stafford
- Cut down berms on Stafford

Facilities repair:

- Adjust the garage door opener and clean the ceiling fans with vertical lift the fire department had rented for one of their projects.
- Critters Be Gone trapped a total of 7 beavers between Valley and Crackel Rd.
- Ms. Nancy Dolezal, Administrative Assistant, and Mr. Fenstermaker worked on a letter to inform residents of the upcoming road improvement projects. The letters have been mailed out.
- The Road Department spread 22 tons of salt one day in April. The total salt usage for the year was approximately 2400 tons and a total of 93 runs. Mr. Matsko and Mr. Fenstermaker filled out the required ODOT forms to participate with their salt consortium with a total of 2100 tons.
- All the roads in Auburn Township were rated by Mr. Fenstermaker. Some roads did decline due to the heavy frost this year.
- There is another depression in the field at Auburn Community Park. J.F.D. Landscapes, Inc., have provided a quote for the repair.
- More potholes were filled (cold patch) on Crackel, West of Auburn Road, Crackel, west of Munn and on Valley Rd.
- The mini excavator went in to have the quick bucket connect repaired.
- The Road Department prepared for Earth Day/road cleanup day. The shop was cleaned, tables and chairs were set up for approximately 20 people who participated.

Mr. Cavanagh said that he and Mr. Fenstermaker are going to be setting up a meeting with the Trustees, Fiscal Officer, and Road Superintendent of Mantua Township, for the upcoming joint road project. Mr. Hajjar, Geauga County Engineer, recommended checking the available fund status of Mantua Township for the joint project.

Mr. Cavanagh brought up the joint road maintenance agreements with neighboring Mantua and Troy Townships. He reported that signed agreements extend back to 2018 and 2019. Mr. Cavanagh felt these agreements should be updated due to changes in elected officials.

Mr. Cavanagh reported that the bid opening for various road projects is Friday, May 9, 2025. The estimated cost for the project is \$1,120,000.00; all of which will be funded by Auburn Township. Mr. Cavanagh said that he will go to the Geauga County Engineer's office on that day, as he would like to know the bid amount ASAP.

Mr. Cavanagh noted the reason for the salt dome being half full - the corner of the dome's foundation needs to be repaired, and they will be getting quotes to repair it.

TRUSTEE & FISCAL OFFICER REPORTS:

Mr. Michael S. Troyan reported he received a call from a constituent who was asking about the opt out for NOPEC. This means that all eligible customers in an aggregated community become part of the buying group unless they take specific action to opt-out of the aggregation. Residents should be receiving information this week or next, for the opt out on natural gas.

Mr. Patrick J. Cavanagh reported the Township does have a speaker for Memorial Day - Amy Bevan, the newly appointed County Administrator. Mr. Cavanagh also noted that they had secured a bagpiper, singers, a soloist and had traffic control taken care of.

Eugene T. McCune Jr. reported that a meeting was held last week with Mr. Matsko, Fiscal Officer, Mr. Fenstermaker, Ms. Dolezal, and AFD Chief John Phillips. They assessed every building owned by the Township – to include the Museum, Adam Hall, Town Hall, Administration Building, Fire Department, Road Garage and Auburn Community Park. They set budgets for repairs and improvements. He noted there were already some cosmetic repairs that were completed at Adam Hall, and in the future, a new roof would probably be needed. Mr. Matsko will review setting aside money in a Capital Improvement Reserve Fund.

Mr. McCune Jr. said that he spoke with Cemetery Sexton, Mike Ludwig, and as of today, Stonehugger Cemetery Restoration LLC, was in the cemetery finishing up the third and final phase of the headstone restoration project, which amounts to \$23,280. The original gift amount for this project was \$75,000 which was left to the Township for the cemetery restoration by Auburn Community Church.

Mr. McCune Jr. will be speaking at the Chagrin Valley Chamber of Commerce – every three to four years they have a public officials luncheon which is in June 2025.

Mr. Dan Matsko, Fiscal Officer, presented the payment listing for payments processed since April 21, 2025 - listing 11 electronic payments processed for \$41,240.47 and 17 warrants were processed for \$16,784.04 totaling \$58,024.51. He also reconciled the bank accounts for April 2025. The balance in the primary checking account was \$1,028,209.16, and in the Star Ohio account, there was a balance of \$2,214,919.32 for a total of \$3,243,128,48.

Mr. Matsko noted that the Township received a final bill from Waste Management, and they charged the Township a total of \$689.22 for the removal of 2 dumpsters. Mr. Fenstermaker noted there were no problems with the new dumpsters from Dumpster Bandit.

Mr. Matsko reported that he attended the funeral for the Honorable Mary Jane Trapp today, and it was well represented by many elected officials from Geauga County.

Mr. Matsko noted that Election Day was tomorrow, May 6, 2025, with three issues on the ballot.

Mr. Cavanagh revisited the \$75,000 donation given to Auburn Township by Auburn Community Church to be spent on improvements at the Museum. Mr. Cavanagh stated the Trustees previously talked about spending approximately \$3000 to \$5000 for door and window maintenance and trim work at the Museum. The church also wanted the Trustees to increase access to the Museum. Mr. McCune Jr. questioned why they would put money into that building, which is open once per year for 2 hours, and 10 people go through it. He thought perhaps in the future, when the budget is larger, maybe they would have enough money to move the building to Adam Hall, put a bathroom in it and open it up for events – and make it useful. Mr. Cavanagh noted it was a beautiful building and was in pretty good shape now.

Mr. McCune Jr. brought up the management agreement to borrow and use equipment from other Townships, and noted that he and Mr. Fenstermaker, and Mr. Troyan were not in favor of the agreement. Mr. Cavanagh said he would speak with other county members while at the Geauga County Engineer's office on Friday, May 9, 2025. Mr. Fenstermaker said they have not used the agreement, and Mr. McCune noted they already have agreements in place with other Townships.

Motion made by Michael S. Troyan and seconded by Patrick J. Cavanagh to decline participation in the Geauga County Resource Rental Program to borrow/lend equipment from other Townships. VOTE: Troyan, yes, Cavanagh, yes; McCune Jr., yes. The motion PASSED.

OLD BUSINESS:

No old business.

NEW BUSINESS:

Mr. McCune Jr. spoke about the quote from J.F.D. Landscapes, Inc., to fix the indentation at Auburn Community Park for \$675.00.

Motion made by Michael S. Troyan and seconded by Patrick Cavanagh to approve the fee from J.F.D. Landscapes Inc., in the amount of \$675.00 to fix the indentation at Auburn Community Park. VOTE: Cavanagh, yes; Troyan, yes; McCune Jr., yes. The motion PASSED.

Mr. Cavanagh reported on Resolution 2025-08, the approval of the Solid Waste Management Plan for the Geauga-Trumbull Solid Waste Management District. With the approval of this plan update, the rate is anticipated to increase to \$7.50 (\$2.00 increase) in 2027 to support new programming and the rising costs of existing programs. This will be the first increase since 2007. These fees are **not** taxes levied against residents, but rather monies remitted by waste haulers in support of required recycling and waste reduction programming. Mr. Matsko read Resolution 2025-08.

Mr. McCune Jr. reported that a 2025 grant award has been approved by NOPEC for Auburn Township, for \$14,124.00, which must be spent by November 30, 2027. The balance from 2023 is \$13,298 (to be spent by November 30, 2025), and the amount of the 2024 balance is \$13,761 (to be spent by November 30, 2026.) The total amount of the grants is \$41,183.00.

Mr. Troyen asked Mr. Keith Blaser, Secretary for the Auburn Fire Department, if the Auburn Fire Department had ideas on how to use extra funds, if they were available. Mr. Blaser said they will need about \$25,000 to \$30,000 to replace their existing mobile data terminal computers (CAD system) to remain compatible with the Geauga County Dispatch system. The county is updating their systems by October 2025. Mr. Blaser said their department submitted a grant application for these computers and it will be a couple of months before they find out if their grant was accepted.
