

Held \_\_\_\_\_ 20 \_\_\_\_\_

The regular meeting of the Auburn Township Board of Trustees was called to order at 7:00 p.m. by Trustee Chairman Eugene T. McCune Jr.. Also in attendance were Trustees Patrick J. Cavanagh and Michael S. Troyan.

The Pledge of Allegiance was led by resident Mr. Keith Blaser.

**GUESTS:**

No scheduled guests attended the meeting.

**MINUTE APPROVAL:**

Motion by Michael S. Troyan, seconded by Patrick J. Cavanagh, to approve the minutes of the Regular Meeting of the Auburn Township Board of Trustees held on May 5, 2025. VOTE: Cavanagh, yes; Troyan, yes; McCune Jr., yes. The motion PASSED.

**SCHEDULED REPORTS:**

Keith Blaser, Auburn Fire Department Secretary, presented the monthly detailed report for the Auburn Fire Department. He presented a Year-to-Date Statistics Report comparing 354 year-to-date (January–April 2025) total calls in 2025 to 300 total calls in 2024 (January–April 2024.) The percentage of multiple calls was 28.25% for January–April 2025 compared to 22.66% in January–April 2024.

Mr. Blaser thanked Trustee Mr. Michael Troyan and Fiscal Officer Mr. Dan Matsko for meeting with the Auburn Fire Department for a budget planning meeting.

Mr. Blaser reported that the Auburn Fire Department will sponsor a youth participant (an Auburn Township resident) in the summer program (June 2025) of Leadership Geauga. Mr. Blaser reported that the Auburn Fire Department awarded their annual \$1500 John Reithoffer Memorial Scholarship at the Kenston Awards Ceremony on Friday, May 16, 2025. The scholarship went to a student who will study nursing.

Mr. Blaser noted that the results came back from the new well that was drilled for the Fire Department, with total dissolved solids (any minerals, salts, metals or organic matters that are dissolved in water) of 2500 to 172 mg/L. Mr. Blaser said they noticed having to use less salt to keep the system functioning.

**TRUSTEE & FISCAL OFFICER REPORTS:**

Mr. Michael S. Troyan reported that he viewed a contract between Munson Township and the Munson Township Fire Department – which is a perpetual contract; one in which the contract is the same, but the numbers and dates change annually. The prosecutor stated if that were something Auburn Township would want to do, and if there was a rational justification for it - at that time, she would look into it more in depth. Mr. Troyan said he will continue to look at this to see if there are any benefits to changing to a perpetual contract. Mr. Troyan felt the current contract they have now works well.

Mr. Patrick J. Cavanagh reported that he attended the bid opening at the Geauga County Engineer’s office for various road projects on Friday, May 9, 2025. The estimated cost for the project was \$1,120,000.00; all of which will be funded by Auburn Township. There were only 2 bids on the project - Ronyak Paving, Inc., and Karvo Paving. There were 2 other Townships in the County that had similar projects of the same scale, and those projects had 4 bids. The Ronyak Paving Inc. bid was the only bid which came in under the estimate.

Mr. Cavanagh attended the BZA Meeting on May 13, 2025, for the proposed gas station / truck stop. The applicant asked for the hearing to be tabled and is recessed until June 10, 2025.

Mr. Cavanagh also spoke about some split rail fence in front of Adam Hall and the volleyball courts that were not in good shape and may need to be replaced. The Trustees discussed whether the fencing should be repaired or replaced. Mr. Troyan suggested the Trustees should get a quote and get it fixed, if repairable; or they might find it may be better just to replace it.

Eugene T. McCune Jr. reported that on behalf of Auburn Township, he attended a meeting with Chagrin River Watershed Partners meeting on May 15, 2025. There were approximately 40 people that attended. There were break-out groups of different communities, and the number one concern discussed was water runoff. One of the mayors of a local community did some charting of rainfall in the Cleveland area – from the 1900's to present. He spoke about 100-year floodplains, which are based on the amount of waterfall in a given time, in an area. The rain that they received two weeks ago in this town would equal a 300-year rainfall; it was over 3 inches of rain in an hour. They have not seen anything like that in their history; their roads can't handle that amount of rainfall.

Mr. McCune Jr. walked through the cemetery recently and observed the work being done by Stonehuggers Cemetery Restoration Inc. on the repair work of headstones, and noted they did some nice work.

Mr. McCune Jr. shared that Hess and Associates Engineering Inc. was recently purchased by another company. Mr. Hess is still working with the company. The first set of drawings came through with the plans for the restroom at Auburn Community Park. In the plans, they changed the location of the tanks; they were originally close to the building - they changed the location of the tanks on their own, without approval from Auburn Township. Mr. Mike Fenstermaker, Auburn Township Road Superintendent, observed the new location when they set the stakes, and contacted Mr. McCune Jr.. Mr. McCune Jr. contacted the company and asked them to move the tanks back to their original location.

Mr. Dan Matsko, Fiscal Officer, presented the payment listing for payments processed since May 5, 2025 - listing 11 electronic payments processed for \$37,818.03 and 22 warrants were processed for \$30,227.94 totaling \$68,045.97.

Mr. Matsko noted Auburn Township has a road levy that is expiring at the end of 2025. He noted that he and Administrative Assistant Nancy Dolezal have discussed the process required to ensure the necessary paperwork is submitted to the Board of Elections 90 days prior to the November election. Mr. McCune Jr. and Mr. Troyan are also up for reelection in November.

**OLD BUSINESS:**

No old business.

**NEW BUSINESS:**

Mr. McCune Jr. spoke about the quote from Auburn Fence for \$1,276.00 to replace the Town Hall fence. Mr. McCune Jr. explained that the neighbors, the Millers, knocked down the Auburn Township fence. There was a dispute as to who owned the fence – and was determined that the fence was owned by Auburn Township. Unfortunately, none of the township's fences are insured. The prosecutor advised the Trustees to replace the fence and send a bill to the Millers. After some discussion the Trustees decided to replace the fence and send the Millers a bill.

**Motion was made by Michael S. Troyan and seconded by Patrick Cavanagh to approve the quote by Auburn Fence Corporation in the amount of \$1,276.00 to put the fence back at Auburn Township Town Hall property and send the Millers a bill. VOTE: Cavanagh, yes; Troyan, yes; McCune Jr., yes. The motion PASSED.**

Mr. McCune Jr. brought up the award bid for the reconstruction of various roads in Auburn Township to Ronyak Paving. Mr. Cavanagh noted there was a letter from the Geauga County Engineer recommending the awarding of the bid. Mr. Cavanagh said there were 2 bidders on the project and Ronyak Paving was determined to be the lowest and best price. The project was estimated by the county Engineer's office at \$1,120,000.00 and the bid came in at \$1,098,295.00.

**Motion made by Patrick J. Cavanagh and seconded by Michael S. Troyan to award the contract for reconstruction and paving of various roads in Auburn Township to Ronyak Paving, in the amount of \$1,098,295.00. VOTE: Troyan, yes, Cavanagh, yes; McCune Jr., yes. The motion passed. The 3 Trustees signed the contract, as well as 3 witnesses who were members of the audience.**




