The regular meeting of the Auburn Township Board of Trustees was called to order at 7:00 p.m. by Trustee Chairman Eugene T. McCune Jr. Also in attendance were Trustees Michael S. Troyan and Patrick J. Cavanagh.

The Pledge of Allegiance was led by Auburn Township Road Superintendent Mike Fenstermaker.

GUESTS:

Mason Daughtery, of Auburn Bainbridge Excavating, was invited by Mr. McCune to share information with the Trustees about another solution to the forthcoming septic system at Auburn Community Park. Mr. Daughtery contacted Mr. McCune Jr. today, and said they had a septic system of a different design that would be more efficient and cost effective than the other quotes Auburn Township had received

Mr. Daughtery suggested a spray system versus a mound system. The spray system incorporates two spray heads, which go off at certain times throughout the night and is based on usage. It is more cost-effective and would leave the park with more useful space. He estimated the cost saving to be \$12,500 by using the spray system versus the mound system

Mr. McCune noted they have received three different quotes for the septic system – one for \$38,000, one for \$50,000 and another one for \$83,000.

Mr. McCune Jr. asked Mr. Dougherty to write up more details about his proposal, so the Trustees can forward it to the Geauga County Health Department for their consent. Mr. McCune Jr. said the plan would also have to be approved by the Western Reserve Land Conservancy.

MINUTE APPROVAL:

Motion by Michael S. Troyan and seconded by Patrick J. Cavanagh to approve the minutes of the Regular Meeting of the Auburn Township Board of Trustees on July 21, 2025. VOTE: Troyan, yes; Cavanagh yes; McCune Jr., yes. The motion PASSED.

SCHEDULED REPORTS:

Mr. Frank Kitko, Zoning Inspector, submitted a Zoning report reflecting 8 applications submitted in the month of July 2025. Mr. Kitko updated the Trustees on some of the current building projects going on in the Township.

Mr. Mike Fenstermaker, Highway Superintendent, gave his monthly report.

Fireworks: Auburn township helped Bainbridge Township with the set up for fireworks. This included a fence around the area that restricts the public from getting near where the fireworks were set off. They set up canopies for the different events and placed cones and barriers for traffic control. On the night of the fireworks, they helped with traffic control at the middle school, and helped clean up after the fireworks were over.

Resident requests: They had many requests for ditching this year due to the amount of rain. A lot of ditching was done in all of Auburn Township – some of which are listed below:

Stafford - east of Auburn Road and west of Quinn. Auburn Springs for five residents; south end of Crackle; Settlers; Colchester; Stafford east of Messenger; Creighton; Carriage; Crackle east of Brookfield; Regal; Creekside.

Repairs:

- Repaired mower head and replaced cable on boom mower.
- Replaced tire on equipment trailer.
- Replaced coolant hose on truck 16.

Capital Improvement Projects: (Morland, Cooper, Jenson and Regal)

- All the roads have been ground, cut to base elevation, and cement stabilized.
- The contractors will wait seven days for the cement to be cured before paving.
- Several residents (approximately 9) have opted not to have the end of their driveways paved but will instead pay a private contractor to concrete the end of their driveways. The engineers will monitor and calculate the cost savings for the residents, and the Township will reimburse them for the asphalt that was not used at the end of their driveway.
- Working with Mantua Twp. on Crackle Rd. We finished repairing the eastern section between Auburn Rd and RT 44 part and will split the cost of the asphalt.

Miscellaneous:

- Picked up a deer on Stafford, East of Messenger.
- Checked trash at the park twice a week.
- Removed downed trees at Shadyside cemetery, Auburn Community Park, Valley Rd., Stafford Rd., and at the Museum.
- Roadside mowing – being done on an almost daily basis

Mr. McCune Jr. asked Mr. Fenstermaker about the implementation of checking the condition of township roads and signs, as well as the parks and playgrounds.

OTARMA recommended conducting and documenting monthly inspections of township roads and signs because of the risk assessment they conducted in June.

OTARMA recommended that the parks and playgrounds be inspected at least weekly during active months and at least monthly during inactive months. The U.S. Consumer Product Safety Commission (CPSC) requires a minimum depth of nine inches for protective surfacing in the use zone of playground equipment.

Mr. McCune Jr. said he knew it would be hard to work in but felt once the checklists were implemented on a regular basis, it would become second nature.

Resident Tom Jones reported a post in the ground on Lindsay Lane – where the road makes a turn – on the north side of the road is loose and coming out. It has a flag on it – which was put in about 25 years ago, to keep the salt truck from going off in the ditch. Mr.

Fenstermaker said he would ask the driver if he used that flag to mark out the road in the winter. If he uses it, they will leave it in. If not, they will remove it.

Mr. Cavanagh addressed Mr. Fenstermaker about the annual Geauga County Road and Bridge program and the permanent striping and other roadway markings. Mr. Fenstermaker said some roads were faded, but you could still see the lines. The Trustees and Mr. Fenstermaker decided to pass on the road striping this year.

Mr. Cavanagh reported that Mr. Fenstermaker has been working with Mantua Township and the Geauga County engineers for the joint road project and they will now focus on the west end of Crackle Road.

TRUSTEE & FISCAL OFFICER REPORTS:

Mr. Michael S. Troyan reported that about a week and a half ago, there was an accident at East Washington Street and Auburn Road. Both vehicles ended up on Town Hall property. One truck hit the building and moved the front stoop. No one was hurt. All the insurance companies involved were notified, and we received the Sheriff's report. Mr. Troyan asked Mrs. Dolezal to cancel any activities that were scheduled in that building, until everything is fixed. The building was examined, and no structural damage was found; there is siding that will have to be replaced and the stoop will need to be repaired. Ms. Dolezal is getting quotes on getting everything fixed and insurance companies coordinated. Mr. Troyan was hopeful that the building would be up and running in a couple of weeks.

Mr. Cavanagh said there was some discussion about the possibility of putting handicap access on that building, and Mr. Kitko took some measurements for it. Mr. Cavanagh said it would be a difficult fit. Mr. Kitko said the handicap access couldn't come out straight, it would have to be east or west. Mr. Troyan and Mr. McCune Jr. thought this was a good time to build handicap access. Mr. Cavanagh noted there might be grant money available for this project.

Patrick J. Cavanagh reported they applied for a cemetery grant from the Ohio Department of Commerce. They will use quotes from JFD Landscapes for stump grinding where a tree was taken out at the cemetery. Mr. Cavanagh noted this was a statewide grant, and not everyone will get it. Mr. Cavanagh thought they could make an annual application for this grant.

Mr. Cavanagh said the roof at Adam Hall was discussed at length at the last meeting. They have a file folder with many of the repairs listed that have been done to that roof in the past. Mr. Gordon Wirik, who is in the construction business, is going to contact some people about the roof. Mr. Wirik will focus on insulation. Mr. Troyan said having a history of that roof will help – it will show someone all the work that was done – what worked and what didn't.

Mr. Eugene McCune Jr. reported that on August 7, 2025, at 2:30 p.m., both he and Mr. Kitko will be meeting with ODOT to go over the traffic study on SR 44, at the Auburn Township Administration building.

Fiscal Office report - Mr. Dan Matsko, Fiscal Officer, presented the payment listing for payments processed since August 4, 2025 - listing 8 electronic payments processed for \$33,354.93, and 17 warrants processed for \$104,239.30, totaling \$137,594.23. Mr. Matsko presented the July 2025 bank reconciliation. The savings accounts as of July 31, 2025, reflect a primary checking account balance of \$1,991,198.81. The balance in the Star Ohio account is \$2,239,887.90.

Mr. Matsko noted the checking account balance will drop considerably once the bill is received from Ronyak Paving, and a final quarter payment is made to the Auburn Fire Department as per their contract.

Mr. Matsko questioned what generates electricity usage at the Museum. The township receives bills averaging \$90.00 per month. Mr. Cavanagh said there is nothing in the building, and the electricity should be shut off for a minimum of 6 months of the year.

Mr. McCune Jr. asked Mr. Matsko to investigate turning off the electricity to the Museum.

OLD BUSINESS:

Mr. McCune Jr. said the Trustees received a quote for Tetherball equipment for Auburn Community Park, which cost \$350. Mr. Troyan said they received information from Mrs. Dolezal about the insurance, and said the equipment could be placed on the grass, and there was no requirement for the depth. Mr. Troyan thought all the Trustees should receive the full report from Mrs. Dolezal – in writing. Mr. Troyan said it didn't sound like it was a big deal with the insurance company and noted the equipment could be placed anywhere. The Trustees decided to table the discussion until they all had the information.

The Township received a quote from G.W. Construction to remove the existing storm windows at Town Hall and paint them for \$5600. They also received a quote for replacing and installing 10 new Marvin windows at a cost of \$35,000.00. After a brief discussion, the Trustees decided to repair the windows instead of replacing them.

Motion made by Michael S. Troyan and seconded by Eugene McCune Jr. to authorize the removal of the existing storm windows at Town Hall, scrape, re glaze, prime and paint the interior and exterior sides of 10 windows for a cost of \$5600.00, to G.W. Construction. VOTE: Troyan, yes; Cavanagh, yes; McCune Jr., yes. The motion PASSED.

NEW BUSINESS:

Motion made by Michael S. Troyan. and seconded by Patrick J. Cavanagh to adopt the Geauga County / ADP Policy, which was submitted and approved by the Geauga County Prosecutor. VOTE: Troyan, yes; Cavanagh, yes; McCune Jr., yes. The motion PASSED.

The Trustees discussed and asked audience members if anyone had any objection to the renewal of all liquor permits in Auburn Township. Auburn Township received correspondence from the Department of Commerce informing the Township of the deadline to express valid objections to the renewal of all liquor permits in Auburn Township by October 1, 2025. There were no objections.

Discussion ensued between Mr. Fenstermaker and the Trustees regarding quotes received from American Asphalt (\$12,191) and MRH Paving & Sealcoating (\$9,800) and Asphalt Fabrics & Specialties (\$28,000) for crack / seal for the Fire Station and Service Garage. Mr. Cavanagh asked Mr. Matsko if there was money in the Fire Department levy fund for their portion, and Mr. Matsko said yes; they would be paying half. The Trustees asked Mr. Fenstermaker to gather some references from previous customers who had work done by MRH. Mr. Fenstermaker said he will also get references from American Asphalt, and the Trustees agreed.

Mr. McCune Jr. said he has signed the CRWP Conflict of Interest Form and will return to Mrs. Dolezal. He then read the upcoming dates for future Township meetings.





ADJOURNMENT:



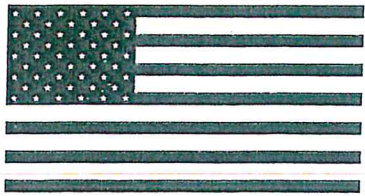
