The regular meeting of the Auburn Township Board of Trustees was called to order at 7:00 p.m. by Trustee Chairman Eugene T. McCune Jr. Also in attendance were Trustees Michael S. Troyan and Patrick J. Cavanagh.

The Pledge of Allegiance was led by Auburn Township Road Superintendent Mike Fenstermaker.

Mr. McCune Jr. made an opening statement about a request a resident made on August 18, 2025, at the Trustee Meeting regarding whether draft minutes of township meetings could be posted and made available sooner to the public. He explained that at the Trustee Meetings, the Chairman always asks if there are any additions or corrections to the minutes. The minutes have not been approved, and the minutes are not to be posted – including the draft of the minutes. If someone wants to come to the Administration Building and look at the draft of the minutes, they are more than welcome to do that. The minutes will not be posted until they are approved.

GUESTS:

Mr. Sawyer Scharver introduced himself as a Life Scout in Troop 101 of Auburn Township and would like to host his Eagle Scout Project at Auburn Community Park. Mr. Scharver was there to share details of his project and get permission from the Trustees and the community.

Mr. Scharver stated that his project will consist of planting eight trees, about 1.5-inch caliper that will come balled. The species of trees he was thinking about are Red Oak, Sweet Gum and a few other species that have good fall colors. Mr. Scharver felt these trees were hardy and would beautify the park, as well as provide shade for the playground area that gets hot during the summer. He also proposed building 2 or 3 bat houses along the tree line to reduce mosquitoes

Mr. Troyan asked what side of the playground the trees would be located, and Mr. Scharver said the west side and the south side. Mr. Scharver said he measured the area, and it was 100 x 105 feet – so they would be planting a tree every 25 feet and at least 6 to 8 feet away from the playground. Mr. Scharver explained the trees he chose had big enough canopies to draw shade onto the playground.

Mr. Troyan asked how far the trees would be from the playground and Mr. Scharver said 6 to 8 feet. Mr. Troyan said his experience with these types of trees is that the root structure tends to follow the diameter of the canopy itself. He shared concerns about roots growing into the playground area and the problems that would present.

Mr. McCune Jr. explained that the tree line was owned by The Western Reserve Land Conservancy and would need their approval before anything was done along the tree line. Mr. McCune Jr. is meeting with a representative from the Western Reserve Land Conservancy about the upcoming sewer project and thought they could also discuss the trees and bat houses at the same time.

Mr. McCune Jr. will set up a meeting next week in the evening for himself, the representative from the Western Reserve Land Conservancy and Mr. Scharver. Mr. McCune Jr. invited anyone else that would like to go as well.

MINUTE APPROVAL:

Motion by Michael S. Troyan and seconded by Patrick J. Cavanagh to approve the minutes of the Regular Meeting of the Auburn Township Board of Trustees on August 18, 2025. VOTE: Troyan, yes; Cavanagh yes; McCune Jr., yes. The motion PASSED.

SCHEDULED REPORTS:

Mr. Frank Kitko, Zoning Inspector, submitted a Zoning report reflecting 9 applications submitted in the month of August 2025.

Mr. Kitko informed the Trustees that Mr. DiNardo has filed a lawsuit against the Auburn Township Zoning Board of Appeals.

Mr. Kitko then addressed the concerns of some residents from the last Trustee's meeting. He said zoning issues with The Patio Bar and Grill have been addressed, letters have been sent, and he has had phone conversations with the establishment. Mr. Kitko said to his knowledge, the music stopped, as far as being on the patio after 10:00 p.m.

Mr. Kitko said he spoke with one of the partners of the business, and they may want to meet with the Trustees regarding the fence they took down and reminded the Trustees that the fence was included in the AGREED JUDGMENT ENTRY between the Patio Lounge and Auburn Township. Mr. McCune Jr. clarified that the fence had to be six feet high and Mr. Cavanagh agreed, unless the Trustee's agree to change the judgement entry. Mr. McCune Jr. asked Mr. Kitko if Zoning sent the owner a letter and Mr. Kitko said yes. Mr. Kitko suggested that the Trustees also send the owner a letter, since a Judgement Entry was a binding legal document that was agreed upon in court.

Resident Scott Bayus again questioned the use of the emergency exit and a dumpster enclosure that he brought up during the last Trustee's meeting. He is also concerned if the parking lot meets current zoning regulations. Mr. Bayus stated that he wanted to be present at a meeting, should there be one between the property owner of The Patio Bar and Grill and the Trustees. Mr. McCune Jr. thought this could happen at a public Trustee's Meeting; he didn't think there had to be a special meeting.

Mr. Troyan brought up another issue that he passed on to Jane Hardy (assistant Zoning Inspector) of a buffer zone of trees with the adjacent property which somewhat blocked some of the headlights coming in and out of the parking lot. Mr. Kitko stated he would investigate that.

Mr. Bayus informed the Trustees that The Patio Bar and Grill did have a band play two weeks ago.

Mr. McCune Jr. said the Trustees will do their best to alleviate the problem.

Mr. Kitko addressed the complaint by residents at the last Trustee's meeting on August 18, 2025, regarding the trucks and tree removal at 16615 Auburn Road. Mr. Kitko stated that he had been to that property 22 times and had yet to see a vehicle, truck or trailer, and spoke to the owner of the property. The owner, Mr. Kuhnle confirmed he has 21 diesel trucks parked inside. Mr. Kuhnle did pull a permit for land disturbing and land clearing. The mound that was discussed at the last Trustee's meeting was not dirt; it was mulch, and will be addressed when the land clearing is completed.

Mr. Kitko added that the property and the building were built under agricultural zoning regulations. Auburn Township Zoning does not prohibit parking trucks inside the enclosed building. Mr. Kuhnle has pulling trucks and show trucks in that building, and occasionally sends employees there to polish, clean and work on the trucks. No transport trailers or tankers are being stored there. Mr. Kitko stated that there are no Auburn Township Zoning violations with the property.

Mr. Mike Fenstermaker, Highway Superintendent, gave his monthly report, noting that all summer, the requests of residents have been skyrocketing – mainly ditching due to a lot of water issues – mainly with ditches that are still wet, so wet that you can't walk in them.

- Cold patching on Colechester
- Fixed some erosion around catch basin on Riverwood
- Picked up a deer on Stafford near Lucky Bell
- Berm repair on Stella and Alex, and on Thorpe, South of Bartholomew
- Added gravel to aprons at 17060 and 17080 Moreland

- Installed new mailbox on Moreland
- Ditching and rock lined ditch on the corner of Chanticlear and Taylor May from erosion due to the heavy rainfall this summer.

Roadside mower:

Roadside mowing when an employee is not needed to help on main road projects.

Grader patching:

- Asphalt patching on Stafford from 44 to Snow

Motion by Patrick J. Cavanagh and seconded by Eugene T. McCune Jr., to approve payment to Ronyak Paving in the amount of \$314,981.80, for work completed through July 30, 2025. This is not the final invoice. VOTE: Troyan, yes; Cavanagh yes; McCune Jr., yes. The motion PASSED.

Mr. Cavanagh noted that Stafford Road is going to close at Route 44 next week. Mr. Fenstermaker added there are 4 phases to that project and will be closed for the first 2 phases and will have barricades. Mr. Fenstermaker said the last email he received from the state engineer said it would be closed from September 8 to September 22, 2025.

Mr. Fenstermaker reported there was a problem with the grill interfering with the plow hitch on the new truck being built; so, it is back at Freightliner now for repair

There was additional discussion with Mr. Fenstermaker regarding repairs on the roadside mower and its' reliability. It appears to be functioning for the time being.

Mr. Fenstermaker noted that subcontractors for utility companies installing fiber optic lines would leave behind cut limbs from trees. Mr. Fenstermaker said they ended up taking the chipper and cleaning up the mess. Mr. Fenstermaker noted that these companies have several different contractors working in different areas of the Township.

TRUSTEE & FISCAL OFFICER REPORTS:

Michael S. Troyan gave an update on the Auburn Community Picnic to be held on September 20, 2025, from 10:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. Music will be provided by Hank B Free from 10:00 a.m. to 1:00 p.m. and Jim Jacobs - the Profit Band from 1:00 p.m. to 4:00 p.m. Food and beverage vendors will include The Bus Stop, Romeo's Pizza, Michael's Lunch Box, Event Novelty (Ice Cream), White Barn Brand (Coffee), and Kinetico water truck. Events include a climbing wall, hayrides by Carl Schneider, inflatable body balls, bounce houses, a bubble station, cornhole, limbo, ker plunk, ladder toss, tic-tac-toe, frisbee hoop toss, hula loops and a guessing game.

Giveaways will be Auburn Township recycling shopping bags, popcorn and Sunrise Springs Water.

Patrick J. Cavanagh reported they applied for a cemetery grant from the Ohio Department of Commerce; it was about \$200,000 spread across the state of Ohio. They used the quote from JFD Landscapes for stump grinding where a tree was taken out at the cemetery. Mr. Cavanagh noted they received the grant in the amount of \$2070.39 and must be used to clear the overgrown area where the tree was removed.

Motion made by Patrick J. Cavanagh and seconded by Michael S. Troyan to accept a grant from the Ohio Department of Commerce, Division of Real Estate, in the amount of \$2070.39 for cemetery improvement. VOTE: Troyan, yes; Cavanagh, yes; McCune Jr., yes. The motion PASSED.

Mr. Cavanagh revisited the issue of Township residents or former residents that were due money from a levy that was incorrectly collected for 3 years. American Legal Claim Services, LLC hired by Geauga County is responsible for distributing the funds. The list of property owners that still have money owed is posted on the Auburn Township website, as well as a form to fill out - to claim the funds due. The deadline to request a refund is September 7, 2025. If these funds are not claimed, they will go to the Ohio Unclaimed Funds.

Mr. McCune Jr. stated that he attended the budget hearing in August with Mr. Dan Matsko, Fiscal Officer, and reported that Mr. Matsko was commended for doing a great job by the Geauga County Budget Commission.

Fiscal Office report - Mr. Dan Matsko, Fiscal Officer, presented the payment listing for payments processed since August 18, 2025 - listing 11 electronic payments processed for \$36,214.66, and 14 warrants processed for \$703,771.41, totaling \$739,986.07. Mr. Matsko reported that the bulk of those payments were for Ronyak Paving \$314,981.80, and the third of three payments to the Auburn Fire Department for \$370,499.20. Mr. Matsko presented the August 2025 bank reconciliation. The savings accounts as of August 31, 2025, reflect a Huntington primary checking account balance of \$1,981,057.69 and the balance in the Star Ohio account is \$2,248,362.42. He noted the Township has been averaging about 4% interest per month in the Star Ohio account, which is approximately \$8,000 per month in dividends. The balance in both accounts at the end of August was \$4,229,420.11.

Mr. Matsko presented Resolution 2025–13, which is for accepting the amounts and rates as determined by the Budget Commission and authorizing the necessary tax levies and certifying them to the County Auditor.

Mr. Matsko explained: the General Fund receives \$557,854 (1.4 mills) and Road and Bridge Levy Fund \$637,548 (1.6 mills) both derived from the inside 10 mill limitation with an additional \$1,347,092 (4.65 mills) from four existing Road and Bridge renewal levies. The Fire Levy Fund receives \$952,077 (3.5 mills) and \$504,176 (1.8 mills) from two existing Fire and Emergency continuing levies.

Motion made by Eugene McCune Jr., and seconded by Patrick J. Cavanagh to accept Resolution 2025-13, for accepting the amounts and rates as determined by the Budget Commission and authorizing the necessary tax levies and certifying them to the County Auditor. VOTE: Troyan, yes; Cavanagh, yes; McCune Jr., yes. The motion PASSED.

Mr. Matsko reported that the Hitching Post no longer sells gasoline from Exxon Mobile, it is now Amoco BP.

Mr. McCune Jr. reported that The League of Women Voters is having their candidate forums and would like to have someone come and speak about the recent road levy, and they do not want it delivered by someone who is running for office. So, it would have to be delivered by Mr. Cavanagh or Mr. Matsko. Mr. Cavanagh thought both he and Mr. Matsko would be there, so they could decide right before it happens. Mr. McCune Jr. thought they both would have to be prepared to speak on the road levy.

NEW BUSINESS:

Motion made by Michael S. Troyan. and seconded by Patrick J. Cavanagh to designate William Koons, Mayor of South Russell Village, as proxy for the NOPEC annual meeting. VOTE: Troyan, yes; Cavanagh, yes; McCune Jr., yes. The motion PASSED.


