The regular meeting of the Auburn Township Board of Trustees was called to order at 7:00 p.m. by Trustee Chairman Eugene T. McCune, Jr. Also present were Trustees Michael S. Troyan and Patrick J. Cavanagh.

The Pledge of Allegiance was led by Kenston Senior Students: Lincoln Bobnar, Adrian Guirguis, and Graysen Bischof.

GUESTS:

Kenston Senior Students, Lincoln Bobnar, Adrian Guirguis, and Graysen Bischof were in attendance to address the Board of Trustees regarding a school project to lower the 35mph speed limit on Lucky Bell Lane.

They began by expressing their concern for the safety of residents and children who walk along Lucky Bell, a through street from Stafford Rd. in Auburn Twp. to Bell St. in Newbury Twp. from motorists traveling at 35mph and greater.

Trustee Patrick Cavanagh addressed the students by stating Auburn Twp. requires the assistance of the Geauga County Engineer before the speed limit on a through street can be changed. Mr. Cavanagh also recalled a study conducted by the county in 2002 resulting in 35 miles per hour as reasonable and safe. A resolution was passed by Auburn Twp. on November 12, 2002, lowering the speed limit to 35 mph. He also reminded everyone that another study would require existing speed limit signs to be removed allowing the speed limit to become 55mph until the study is completed.

Trustee Michael Troyan suggested the students request the county place stop signs or speed bumps along Lucky Bell and request the sheriff's department monitor the speed as options.

Chairman Eugene McCune thanked the students for attending and commended them for wanting to do something positive for their community.

MINUTE APPROVAL:

Motion by Michael S. Troyan and seconded by Patrick J. Cavanagh to approve the minutes of the Regular Meeting of the Auburn Township Board of Trustees on November 17, 2025. VOTE: Troyan, yes; Cavanagh, yes; McCune Jr., yes. The motion PASSED.

SCHEDULED REPORTS:

Auburn Zoning Inspector Frank Kitko reported that the Zoning Department processed seven zoning applications in November. He noted ongoing activity with the Precision Building and coffee shop at Auburn Corners in addition to the Auburn Inn drilling a new well. There were no questions for Mr. Kitko from the audience.

Mr. Cavanagh presented the November activity report for **Road Superintendent Mike Fenstermaker** in his absence.

- Preventive maintenance and minor repairs on trucks 14, 15, 16, 18, & 19. Set up all trucks with spinners, spreaders and plows for preparation of winter weather. Truck 18 sent to Ascendance Truck Center to diagnose truck warning lights.
- Asphalt patching in the Meadows, Downy Glenn, Saybrook, Curry, Creighton, Thorpe, Dawson, Waterford Trail and White Oak.
- One cemetery burial on Nov.14.
- Auburn Community Park: Met with Auburn Bainbridge Excavating about septic installation. Installation is complete.
- Removed old driveway pipe on Franks Road at residents' request and removed deer at Lucky Bell and Shadow Wood.
- Training: Drove road department employees Nathan, Thad and Brian on new snowplow routes.

- Snow events requiring salt and plow on Nov. 10, 11, 27, 28, 29, & 30.
- November 2025 salt usage, 243 tons. Average November usage for last 20 years is 75.5 tons. Previously high usage was 296 tons in November of 2014. A requisition for 300 tons of additional salt was submitted today.

It was noted that new employee Thaddeus Wojtasik while replacing the fuel filter on Truck 18 noticed metal shavings in the fuel casing. The fuel system was flushed preventing any potential serious damage to the engine.

TRUSTEE & FISCAL OFFICER REPORTS:

Mr. Troyan reported that the township received \$4,605.32 in franchise fees from Charter Communications and suggested the money be placed in the Land Acquisition and Improvement Fund.

Motion by Michael S. Troyan and seconded by Eugene McCune Jr. to place \$4,605.32 in franchise fees from Charter Communications in the Land Acquisition and Improvement Fund. VOTE: Troyan, yes; Cavanagh, yes; McCune Jr., yes. The motion PASSED.

Mr. Cavanagh will defer his time until New Business

Fiscal Office report - Mr. Dan Matsko, Fiscal Officer, presented the payment listing for payments processed since November 17, 2025 - listing 11 electronic payments processed for \$252,682.78 and 25 warrants processed for \$45,030.63, totaling \$297,713.41. Mr. Matsko noted the annual bond payment to Middlefield Banking Company for the service garage and fire department was made totaling \$217,160.00. He also presented the November Bank Reconciliation noting the Primary Middlefield Bank checking account on November 30, 2025, had a balance of \$320,048.75 and the Star Ohio Investment Account balance was \$2,021,847.81.

Mr. Matsko and Mr. Riley Davis (Trustee elect) attended Geauga County “Property Tax Abolishment Response Taskforce” (PTART) meeting earlier that day. Mr. Matsko reported the meeting was hosted by Geauga County Commissioner Carolyn Brakey, Prosecutor Jim Flaiz and Auditor Charles Walder. In attendance were representatives of various entities within Geauga County.

The purpose of the meeting was to inform and educate the recipients of property tax revenue on the impact to their community if the ballot initiative to eliminate property taxes in Ohio is placed on the November 2026 ballot. If passed, it would amend the Ohio Constitution to ban taxes on real property including land and buildings. Geauga County Auditor Chuck Walder emphasized the need to be proactive versus reactive by preparing for the worst and developing a plan - should the initiative pass. Those in attendance received a Comprehensive Demographic & Economic Analysis of Geauga County – Summary and a comprehensive document Identifying the Impact of Eliminating Property Taxes on Ohio Counties and Townships.

Each entity in attendance had the opportunity to explain the impact of losing property tax revenue to their community. Representing Auburn, Mr. Matsko explained that Auburn Twp. would no longer have the funds to pay wages and salaries or fund the EMS and Fire services and maintenance of township roads, including snow plowing.

Alternative methods of funding were discussed and the impact of legally binding long-term contracts intended to be funded by future incoming property tax revenue. Entities were asked to take this information back to their residents to educate and inform them before they vote on this issue in November 2026.

NEW BUSINESS:

Keith Blaser, Auburn Fire Department Board of Directors Secretary presented the 2026 contractual agreement with Auburn Township for Fire and EMS

services. Mr. Blaser reported that the 2026 agreement is identical to last year except for a 2.8% Cost of Living Allowance increase of \$31,121.90 from \$1,111,492.62 to \$1,142,619.54.

Mr. Troyan asked Fiscal Officer Dan Matsko if enough funds were available for the increase. Mr. Matsko said yes, the increase would reduce the amount of fire funds available for maintenance and repairs of the fire department building.

Mr. Troyan suggested, since only the dollar amount of the contract changed to not send it to the prosecutor’s office for review. The other trustees agreed.

Motion by Michael S. Troyan and seconded by Eugene McCune Jr. to not send the 2026 Auburn Fire Department Contractual Agreement to the prosecutors’ office for review. VOTE: Troyan, yes; Cavanagh, yes; McCune Jr., yes. The motion PASSED.

Trustee Patrick Cavanagh presented Resolution 2025-17: RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING Patrick J Cavanagh, MEMBER OF THE AUBURN TOWNSHIP BOARD OF TRUSTEES, TO SERVE AS THE CHIEF EXECUTIVE OFFICER AND CERTIFYING REPRESENTATIVE TO SUBMIT AN APPLICATION TO PARTICIPATE IN THE OHIO PUBLIC WORKS COMMISSION (OPWC) STATE CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT AND/OR LOCAL TRANSPORTATION IMPROVEMENT PROGRAM (S) AND TO EXECUTE CONTRACTS AS REQUIRED and the State of Ohio Public Works Commission Application for Financial Assistance.

Motion made by Michael S. Troyan and seconded by Eugene T. McCune Jr., adopt Resolution 2025-17. VOTE: Troyan, yes; Cavanagh, yes; McCune Jr., yes. The motion PASSED.

Mr. Cavanagh presented Resolution 2025-18: RESOLUTION OF CONVENIENCE & NECESSITY FOR THE IMPROVEMENTS OF VARIOUS ROADS WHEREAS, the Auburn Township Board of Trustees (the Board) has determined that the public convenience and welfare require the improvement of Crackel Road (TR 0269) from the Bainbridge Corp Line to Munn Road and from Thorpe Road to Auburn Road in Auburn Township, and to authorize the Geauga County Engineer to prepare engineering plans in accordance with Section 5573.01 of the Ohio Revised Code.

Motion made by Michael S. Troyan and seconded by Patrick J. Cavanagh, adopt Resolution 2025-18. VOTE: Troyan, yes; Cavanagh, yes; McCune Jr., yes. The motion PASSED.

Mr. Cavanagh presented: MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING REGARDING FUNDING OBLIGATIONS FOR THE IMPROVEMENT OF CRACKEL ROAD, TR 0269 (ALSO KNOWN AS HARNER ROAD) LOCATED IN AUBURN TOWNSHIP, GEAUGA COUNTY AND MANTUA TOWNSHIP, PORTAGE COUNTY BETWEEN THE AUBURN TOWNSHIP TRUSTEES AND THE MANTUA TOWNSHIP TRUSTEES

Motion made by Patrick J. Cavanagh and seconded by Michael S. Troyan, to accept Memorandum of Understanding regarding funding obligations for the improvement of Crackel Rd. in Auburn Twp. and Mantua Twp. between Auburn Twp. Trustees and Mantua Twp. Trustees VOTE: Troyan, yes; Cavanagh, yes; McCune Jr., yes. The motion PASSED.

Chairman Eugene McCune Jr. signed a warranty agreement from Advanced Aeration for a two-year free initial service policy for the onsite sewage facility treatment system installed by Auburn Bainbridge Excavating.

Mr. McCune Jr. reported receiving a \$15,208.50 NOPEC grant to be applied towards the Auburn Community Park Septic System, a Scrap Tire Grant for \$3,933.60 from Geauga Trumbull Solid Waste Mgmt. for reimbursement of costs associated with disposal of tires in June and a 2026 OTARMA MORE Safety Grant for \$937.81 to be applied towards the purchase of Personal Protective Equipment (PPE).

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Mr. McCune Jr. welcomed four 2026 BZA and ZC Board applicants, John Nesi, Marc Kolanz, Axel Fisser, and Brian Spann. The Trustees explained the role and basic job description of the Zoning Commission and Board of Zoning Appeals to the applicants. They asked the applicants some basic questions regarding their interest in wanting to serve on the zoning board. Their responses were noted, and they were thanked for their interest in applying to the zoning board.

Mr. McCune Jr. read the upcoming Save the Dates from the agenda. Mr. Cavanagh asked Mr. Matsko if he would require anything other than paying the bills and administering the Oath of Office to the newly elected trustees. Mr. Matsko indicated that he thought nothing more would be required.
